



## SETTING UP YOUR SLACKLINE

**WARNING:** Read User's Manual thoroughly before attempting to use this slackline. Failure to do so could result in serious injury or death. This slackline is not a toy. Use only under constant adult supervision.




Anchor the ratchet line by wrapping the webbing around the tree and passing the ratchet through the black loop. Make sure to use the included tree protectors and additional padding as needed.

Anchor the main webbing to the opposite tree by wrapping it around the tree and threading the free end through the black loop. Unroll the slackline, making sure the patterned side faces up without twists in the line.




With the ratchet handle facing down, feed the free end of the main slackline webbing into the horizontal slot on the ratchet pin...






... and pull the slack all the way through. Use both hands to pull downward and away from the ratchet, in the direction of the arrow shown above.




Holding the slack tight, crank the lever handle up and down to tighten the slackline. Do not over-tighten.




## **UNDERSIDE VIEW**




Once the desired tightness has been reached, lock the ratchet into place by pulling the release lever and fully closing the ratchet so the handle lies flat against the webbing. Make sure the safety catch locks the gears into place with a distinct "click" sound. When properly locked the ratchet handle should not be able to move.



## TO RELEASE



To release the slackline, pull the release lever to unlock the ratchet, then, using a firm grip, push the lever handle all the way open until the tension is released from the slackline. Be sure to keep fingers clear from the ratchet during this step as releasing tension in the slackline creates tremendous force.



Finally, pull the main slackline webbing out from the ratchet in the direction of the blue arrow, away from the ratchet. Reverse steps 1 and 2 on the previous page to unwrap the webbing from around the trees.
